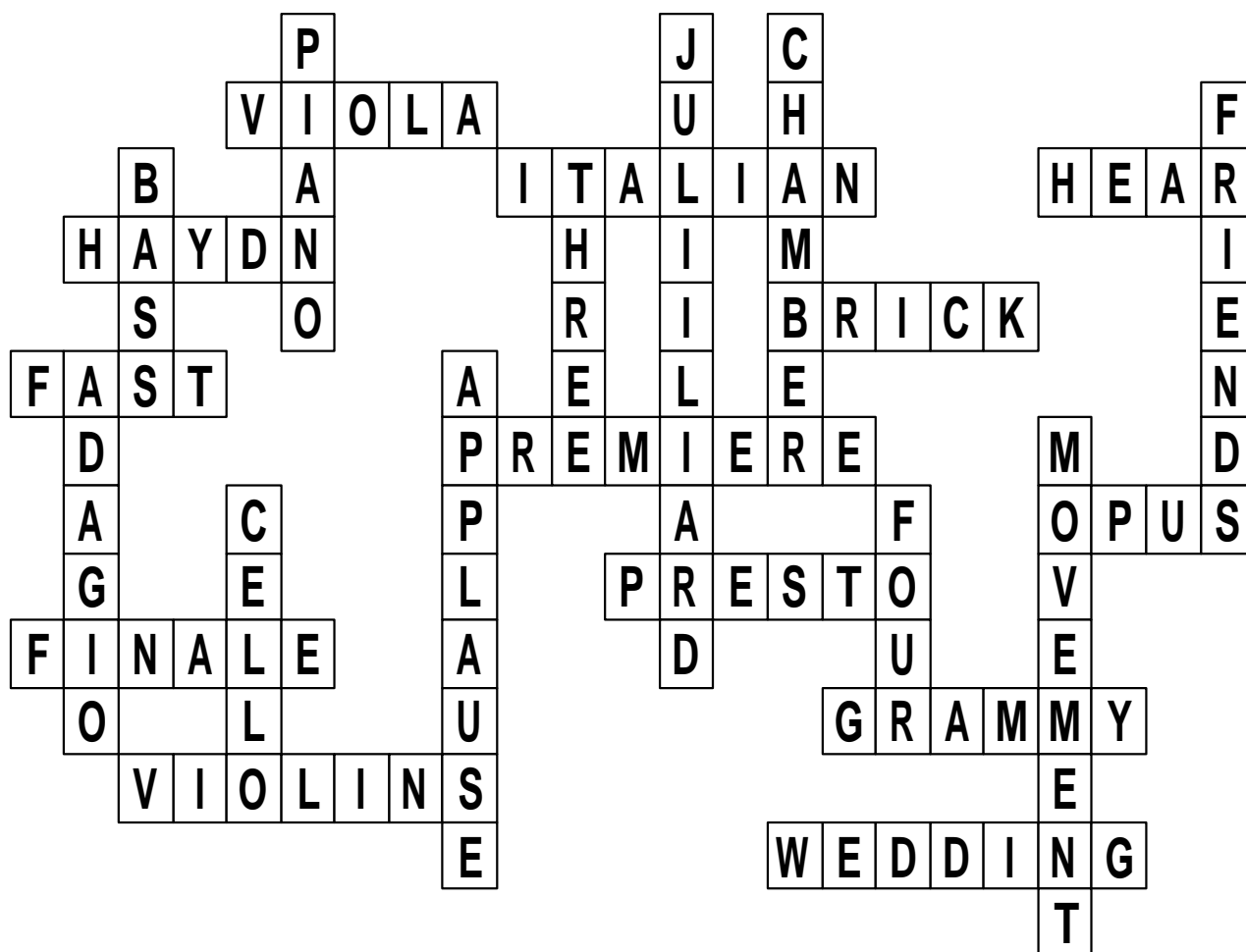

The **Juilliard String Quartet** is a classical music string quartet founded in 1946 at the Juilliard School in New York.

A string quartet is made up of four string instruments and players; two violins, one viola, and one cello.

The quartet is currently quartet-in-residence both at the Juilliard School and the Library of Congress. It has also received numerous awards including four Grammys and membership in the National Academy Recording Arts and Sciences Hall of Fame.

The quartet plays a wide range of classical music, including the music of composers of long ago, as well as contemporary or current composers.

The quartet began recording in 1949 and now has recorded over 100 items.

In a history of "Firsts," the Juilliard Quartet has played the world premieres of works by more than 60 American composers.
